Dr. Rosemary Mealy is a former radio journalist, educator and notably recognized longtime activist for peace, social and economic justice. Her work has involved years of solidarity with the Cuban Revolution, including living and working in Cuba. In 2011, Dr. Mealy was awarded the Friendship Medal by the Council of State of the Republic of Cuba. She is the author of numerous publications including "Fidel and Malcolm X: Memories of A Meeting" (Black Classic Press 2014).



Joan P. Gibbs is a longtime activist, writer and attorney. Joan received her Doctor of Jurisprudence from Rutgers Law School and is a member of the bars of the states of New York, New Jersey, the United States District for the Southern District of New, the Eastern District of New York, the United State Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit and the Supreme Court of the United States. Joan has been involved in Cuban solidarity for several decades. She was a member of both of the committees that Welcomed Fidel Castro to NY during his last two visits to the speak at the UN.



Pierre Labossiere is Co-Founder of the Haiti Action Committee (HAC) and the Haiti Emergency Relief Fund (HERF) established in the Bay Area in 1991 and 2004 respectively. Working with Haiti's grassroots movement that is engaged in the struggle for justice and democracy, HAC and HERF provide information regarding conditions on the ground, assist refugees and support community-based initiatives and institutions working for the liberation and the rebuilding of Haiti.



Henry I Padrón-Morales is a lifelong advocate of Independence for Puerto Rico. He is a retired Dual Language Bilingual Kindergarten educator and current co-owner of Hipocampo Children's Bookstore in Rochester, NY.



Jessie Fuentes is a life-long resident and activist in the Humboldt Park Community in Chicago, IL. Jessie is a graduate of Dr. Pedro Albizu Campos Puerto Rican High School, which was founded in 1973 to combat the high dropout/pushout rate among Puerto Rican youth. Jessie has played a leading role in empowering young people in the community, the international campaign to free Oscar López Rivera, community stabilization and anti-gentrification work, educational reform, and struggle to decolonize of Puerto Rico. She is presently the Director of Policy and Youth Advocacy for the Puerto Rican Cultural Center.
